File Format

Abstracts must be submitted in Microsoft Word.

Layout

The entire abstract (including title, authors, and affiliations) must fit within one 8 1/2" x 11" paper. Use 1.5-inch margins on all sides. Use Times New Roman 11 point black font. All lines must be single-spaced, do not insert extra lines between paragraphs except for after that author/affiliation section. Indent each paragraph 3 spaces. Do not use tabs to indent. Use full justification so that text is flush with both left and right margins.

Title and Authors

CAPITALIZE THE ENTIRE TITLE. Authors should be listed using initials followed by last names with each name separated by commas. Underline the name of the presenting author. Create a new line for author affiliations indicated by superscript numbers. Include institution name, city, state, and country. Omit degrees, titles, street address, and zip code.

Content

Organize the body of the abstract as follows: a statement of the purpose of the study, a statement of the methods used, a summary of the results presented in sufficient detail to support the conclusions, a statement of the conclusions reached. Do not use subheadings (e.g. Methods, Results).
