Position Summary: The University of Wisconsin–Madison Shelter Medicine Program seeks qualified applicants for a three-year Shelter Medicine Residency for graduate veterinarians. This shelter medicine residency program is approved through American Board of Veterinary Practitioners. There is one residency position available.

Dates of Residency: Expected start date in July 2019, to run 3 years from start date.

Salary: \$29,800-\$31,800, plus a professional development allowance

Benefits: 5 professional days, 10 days of vacation, 5 days of sick annually, non-cumulative. For health insurance and other benefits, see <u>http://www.ohr.wisc.edu/benefits/new-emp/grad.aspx</u>.

Scope of Position:

The position is designed to provide the resident with a well-rounded experience in the practice of clinical shelter medicine and surgery. The resident will be expected to develop clinical and didactic teaching skills and gain experience in shelter animal research, presentations, and consultations. Residents are responsible for providing program and research support for the University of Wisconsin Shelter Medicine Program and will complete required clinical rotations in the University of Wisconsin School of Veterinary Medicine clinic in Madison, Wisconsin. Clinical training will be supplemented with participation in the UW Shelter Medicine Program research projects, presentations, and shelter consultations. Receipt of Certificate of Residency will depend on successful completion of all the requirements of the clinical program. It is the responsibility of the resident to fulfill all of the American Board of Veterinary Practitioners (ABVP) residency requirements. Learn more about <u>ABVP residency requirements here.</u>

Duties and Responsibilities:

- 1. Assist with research projects as directed.
 - a. Conduct data collection
 - b. Complete data analysis
- 2. Assist with development of shelter medicine educational materials.
- 3. Prepare presentations.
 - a. National rounds
 - b. Online seminars
 - c. Shelter Medicine Elective Course
 - d. Others as assigned

- 4. Assist with consultations including interactions with shelters throughout the United States and internationally.
- 5. Respond to email and phone requests for help from shelter staff and volunteers.
- 6. Assist with mentoring/training students, fellows, and interns.
- 7. Lead and assist in disease outbreak interventions including conducting on-site sample collection from shelter disease outbreaks.
- 8. Complete clinical rotations required to meet ABVP residency requirements for Shelter Medicine.
- 9. Coordinate with the Shelter Medicine Program team on outreach activities.
- 10. Other duties as assigned by the Director and other staff of the Shelter Medicine Program.

Minimum Requirements:

- Graduate of an accredited school of veterinary medicine.
- Ability to obtain Wisconsin veterinary license prior to residency start date. For more information and licensure fee, refer to: <u>http://drl.wi.gov/</u>.
- It is the responsibility of the applicant to determine if there are immigration, visa, or state licensing requirements that would preclude participation in a residency program at the University of Wisconsin School of Veterinary Medicine. Please check with the United States Embassy in the location nearest your home for details. A successful applicant will be responsible for ensuring eligibility for employment in the United States on or before the effective date of the appointment.
- 2-3 years of Shelter Medicine practice experience or Shelter Medicine Internship preferred.
- A strong interest in shelter medicine, and knowledge and experience working with a wide variety of animal species.
- Ability to provide compassionate patient care with a high degree of emotional resilience.
- Ability to accommodate various work assignments and schedules to meet shelter needs.
- Willingness and ability to travel, sometimes with minimal notice
- Entry-level patient care, surgery, and medical diagnostic abilities.
- Excellent teamwork skills.
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills.
